EMBED PROGRAMME



St Kilian's is the pilot school for a new programme with the UCD Access Office, called EMBED. The idea was developed with Dr Daniel Crean, a past-pupil and now an Assistant Professor in the

School of Veterinary at UCD. The initiative involves Dr Crean being based at the school every Tuesday morning until Christmas. In cooperation with the school's Guidance Team, he is leading a mentoring programme with the 6th Years.

SCHOOL REFURBISHMENTS

During the summer months, **Room 6 (Maths)** and **Room 7 (History/English)** were refurbished and fitted with student computer work stations. A major refurbishment of **Room 28 (Demonstration Room)** is planned for the Halloween Break.

An application has been made for funding to carry out a <u>complete replacement</u> of the school's heating system. This is a major project which can only be addressed under the DES's **Summer Works Scheme**.
